A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE UPDATED ADAMS COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, natural, technological, and man-made hazards can affect Tyrone Township; and

WHEREAS, significant structural, historical, and economic losses could result from an occurrence of a natural, technological, or man-made hazard events; and

WHEREAS, undertaking mitigation projects during pre-disaster periods could decrease the total losses Tyrone incurs as a result of said hazard occurrences.

AND WHEREAS, the Tyrone Township Board of Supervisors has a strong interest in reducing losses from future hazard occurrences; and

WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation plan is a federal and state requirement to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation funding, and, by that requirement, must be updated a minimum of every five years; and

WHEREAS, a cooperative, joint effort is a proven, efficient way to plan for and reduce hazard susceptibility in all government jurisdictions in Adams County, Pennsylvania.

THEREFORE, the Tyrone Township Board of Supervisors has partnered with the county to update the existing Adams County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in an effort to further identify, define, and characterize the hazards affecting the Township as well as to continue identifying and prioritizing projects that could lessen hazard vulnerability.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Tyrone Township Board of Supervisors does hereby adopt the updated Adams County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan this 3rd day of March, 2021.
